# Keep on keeping on!

Big Ben the builder was a man I knew in a church we attended years ago. His name was entirely accurate, he was a builder and he was big! He was also strong. I remember a conversation with him about what he'd been doing the previous week and he'd been digging out foundations. I assumed he might have used a JCB or equivalent, but no, Big Ben the builder dug the foundations of the extension he was building with a spade. As we were involved in creating a garden at the time, and I was making new borders where there were none, and it was hard going in a cold and drizzly February, I asked him, how he kept digging for a whole day, and he said it was simple – keep a steady pace that you can maintain. I have often thought of Big Ben's advice when faced with any big task.

By the time this is published, our two churches will have been in vacancy for almost 2 months, so well done to everyone who has taken on new responsibilities, or increased what they normally do, or just missing having a Vicar or Priest-in-Charge. Vacancies have a habit of being longer than we would like and the potential of tiring us out. So, keep a steady pace that you can maintain!

Mutual encouragement is a great motivator and helps us maintain our fervour and strength for the long haul. Listen to what the writer to the book of Hebrews says – 'Let us hold unswervingly

to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. And let us consider how we may spur one another on towards love and good deeds.' (Hebrews 10.23-24)

Firstly we have hope! Hope that is much bigger than the belief that God has a plan for the future leadership of our two churches and he knows the person who he is calling to the post. That's re-assuring and helps keep us going. But our hope about this local issue is part of our hope about bigger issues — we have faith that God is in control and his plan for redeeming our lives and our world through Jesus is solid and certain. Our hope in life is not built on wishful thinking, but on the rock of God's promises.

Secondly, we have the encouragement of each other to spur us on to love and good deeds. Keep a look out for those who are taking on extra to help them keep a steady pace that they can maintain. Just because we're building the Kingdom of God, it doesn't mean that the normal rules of steady building don't apply!

And when we are facing something where the end is not in sight, it is good to remember that as Christians, Jesus is always in sight – 'And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith.' (Hebrews 12.1b-2a)

## APCM and the PCC

Each year, normally towards the end of April, we hold our Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM). This year we met on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> April, but whereas we normally meet up in church after the morning service, this year we were only able to meet on Zoom. The meeting is important because we elect our Wardens each year, and other PCC members also come up for election on a rotation basis so that there are three or four places each year, but also some continuity. This year there were a total of eight PCC members to be elected, in addition to the two wardens. Perhaps this all sounds boring and irrelevant to you, but as a charity, and a church, St Nicolas needs to have trustees to take charge of the building, the patterns of worship, the mission of the church locally, and of course the money that we all give to make the work of the church possible.

This year there have been some changes to the line-up of the PCC. Roger Parker has retired as Warden after ten years of service, and his place has been filled by Garry Clarke. Nick Shaw was re-elected for a further year as warden. Of the ordinary PCC members Dawn Beasley (also chair of St Nicolas Academy governors), and Dave Sedgewick were re-elected, as was Jean Bailey after a break from last year. Newly elected to the PCC are Jim Keeley our treasurer who was previously co-opted, Julie Bannister, Adam and Helen Fielder, and our Parish Administrator Marina Betteridge. These join the existing members: David Bailey (PCC secretary), Lynn Keeley (Safeguarding Officer), Carole Harris (Lay Vice-Chair), Sally-Ann Veasey, and our three Deanery Synod Members, Peter Rogers, John Hitchcock, and Dean Moore.

Firstly, we must provide a Parish Profile that gives an accurate picture of life at St Nicolas (& St James) with a view to attracting the interest of prospective applicants. The PCC has now agreed on who should draft this profile, and the process will take a few weeks till we are all agreed on the format. With St Nicolas being a Crown appointment, this requires approval at all stages by a representative of The Queen......and also by the Archdeacon...

Secondly, we hope to be able to advertise the vacancy at the end of August/early September.

And finally, assuming a suitable candidate feels the call to Nuneaton, to have carried out an interview and agree someone to start their ministry here towards the end of this year or early next.

# **FCO TIPS**

We are all stewards of God's creation and need to participate in reducing our impacts, one small step at a time:

Here are a few simple things to consider.

# The energy we use:

- o switch your electricity provider to a green supplier
- o wear an extra layer of clothing and turn the thermostat down 1 or 2 degrees
- o use a hot water bottle or an extra blanket, instead of running the heating overnight
- o if buying new appliances, go for AAA energy-rated ones
- o don't leave appliances on stand-by when not in use
- o place your table or desk by a window so you do not need a light on
- o switch to low-energy light bulbs
- o only boil the water you actually need in the kettle
- o insulate your home (windows and walls) if affordable
- install solar panels and generate your own electricity!

## The food & drink we consume:

- o plan meals ahead & only buy what you know you'll use
- buy food with less packaging (particularly plastic)
- o check the food miles and buy local or British if possible
- o buy British fruit and veg in season and fairly traded food if affordable
- o avoid buying coffee (or tea) in a disposable cup; have your own and save money too
- o avoid serving drinks at church in single-use cups
- o avoid buying water in a plastic bottle, have a re-fillable cup
- try to support local shops
- eat less meat and dairy try one meat-free day a week, and explore the wonderful world of meatless cuisine – it is amazing
- try to eat LOAF (Locally produced, Organically grown, Animal friendly, Fairly traded)
   food if this is practical for you
- o grow some of your own food
