## Christmas is coming

I think it every year and probably say it most years – 'how come it's December already, how did we get to this point so quickly? There's still so much to do to prepare for Christmas!'

I have to remind myself that units of time are the same despite seeming much longer to a child counting off each sleep before Christmas compared to busy adults who wish that there were more hours in the day.

Into the mix, comes Advent, a pre-Christmas gift or another thing to fit in? Just when we are at our busiest, we're encouraged to slow down, take time out, rest-up, listen to God, read some devotional material and pray! A time to take stock, even. That's the last thing any busy retailer is doing during Advent!

The Bible passages set as readings during Advent are designed to put the first advent, and the future advent of Jesus, in context, inviting us to stand back and think why we need a Saviour (Christmas) and a Lord (Second Coming) and what the world was like before the first advent and what to expect before the second advent. This is a part of taking stock, but there's another aspect to this too. During the Advent season, we're invited to take stock of where we are now, to welcome Jesus into our here-and-now-everyday lives.

This Advent, if we only focus on the nativity and ignore the back-story, we will probably miss the point of Christmas. If we look forward to Jesus coming again and are ignorant about the signs, like the Bridesmaids in Jesus' story (Matthew 25 v 1-13), we will be unprepared for his return. And if we are so busy preparing for the festivities of Christmas with no time to listen, watch and pray, we'll miss out on drawing close to Jesus, the one the past and future advents are all about.

Advent is a multi-directional season: planning to celebrate an historic event; looking forward to a promised event; seeking a current event. So what is the 'current event' that we should be seeking during Advent? Is it about deciding what we want God to do for us or for a particular situation we, or others close to us, face? Inviting God to sort out for us a current problem by drawing closer to the divine fixer of human dilemmas? Or could Advent be an opportunity to simply draw closer to God, in, rather than for, our current situation? Could it be a time to renew our relationship with God simply because He is God. If we can make space for him in the busiest moments of life, it shows just how important He is to us.

Slowing down, taking time out, resting-up, listening and praying are important at all times in our life, but perhaps most important when we've got a lot on. So, how about using the Church of England 'At the Heart of Christmas' App that will give you a daily devotion for Monday to Saturday for each week of Advent?

Elsewhere in this newsletter you'll find details of the Christmas services at both churches and may I take this opportunity on behalf of Juliette and me, to wish everyone at St James and St Nicolas a very happy Christmas and God's blessing in 2022.






## ECO TIPS

You may have heard the term EPC but never knew what it meant; well hopefully after reading this, you will be fully aware.

EPC stands for "Energy Performance Certificate"



If you have recently bought an electrical appliance such as a fridge, freezer or washing machine, you might have seen something like this in the documentation; this tells you the energy rating, the electricity usage per year, the noise it makes and its capacity. An EPC tells you similar things about your house.

The EPC works using a computer-based algorithm and looks at several categories: Walls, Roof, Floor, Windows, Main Heating, Main Heating Controls, Secondary heating, Hot Water and lighting.

By assessing all these categories, an estimate of the cost of running the home for a three-year period is generated together with potential costs over the same period providing certain improvements are made to various categories; these are listed on the report produced together with associated costs to implement them.

The EPC on my house was conducted in July 2020, it cost me about £70 and scored my house as a "B" with an 86 score and a suggestion that floor insulation costing £4,000 to £6,000 could save me £222 over the three years and improve my score to "B" 88; needless to say I won't be implementing that! Despite that, the report is an interesting and useful document.

Should you decide to go for an EPC, it is worth mentioning if you have had any "invisible" improvements such as cavity wall insulation of a topup of roof insulation as the algorithm assumes for example that a house of a certain age doesn't have cavity wall insulation and only a certain level of roof insulation.

# What can you do to help others in a practical way?


