Dear Friends,

Happy New Year! What have we, at St Nicolas and St James Churches, got to look forward to this year? Lots! 365 days of fresh starts to begin with. Each new day of 2022 is an opportunity to encounter God's love afresh. 'New every morning, it's new, the love of God for me is wonderfully new' so goes the hymn based on the Bible promise in Lamentations chapter 3 verses 22 & 23.

As well as this promise (which is really 365 promises a year!), there is Jesus' promise never to leave us, but to go with us, if we step out into 2022 putting our hand into God's hand. In a time of great danger, darkness and distress for this country, a young Princess Elizabeth suggested to her father, King George VI that he might include the following lines from one of her favourite poems in his Christmas broadcast - 'I said to the man who stood at the Gate of the Year "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied, "Go out into the darkness, and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light, and safer than a known way."' And in 1939, the King did.

During Advent, I was thinking quite a lot about expectations, and preached a sermon on faith expectations on the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Advent. Those who waited in great expectancy prior to the first Christmas based their hopes and aspirations on faith that God would fulfil his promises. Amongst many other things, Christmas celebrates that God is a promise keeper and God's promised Saviour was born. The truths

remembered during Advent are not to be forgotten after Christmas; they are to be lived out each day of a new year.

One promise I was reminded of during Advent was a Bible verse God led me to prior to coming to Weddington. It is from Isaiah chapter 43 verses 18 & 19 -<sup>18</sup> "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. 19 See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. When 3 other people also mentioned this verse within a few days of each other, I began to sit up and think. One of them was Bishop John when he was leading a retreat for the Nuneaton Clergy Chapter the day before my licensing. His sense was that these verses were a promise for the Nuneaton deanery.

So we have a lot of new things to look forward in 2022 based on God's promises to us. But we will have to make sure that the faith expectations for 2022 don't fade at the same pace as our New Year resolutions! Will we match the discouragements and difficulties that the year might bring with faith in God, the promise keeper?

St Nicolas Church cleaning 8<sup>th</sup> January 9.30am



### St Nicolas Church Finance Update



#### A Big Thank You!

Happy New Year to everyone.

The first thing to say is thank you to those who gave to our St Nicolas Patronal Festival in December.

Your donations amounted to over £1100 and we can add Gift Aid to a lot of that money. A fantastic contribution, thank you all again!

#### QR Code – Another way to give

We have made it easier to give with more options.

The new yellow envelopes on the backs of seats and at the back of Church now have a QR Code which you can scan with your smartphone and it will link you to our online giving page. This is the same page that you go to when you press 'Donate' on our website. You will also see our website address on the envelopes if you want to visit it and then you can use the 'Donate' button.

You will see the QR code dotted around the church and you can scan that to donate too.







We can claim 25% on top of your donations at no cost to you if you are a taxpayer and you register for Gift Aid. People who pay directly into our bank account or use the Parish Giving Scheme can register for Gift Aid once and then we can claim Gift Aid for every donation. If you use the envelopes, please make sure to complete the full details if you would like us to claim Gift Aid, i.e. your full name, house number or name, and post code. We cannot claim if any one of these details is missing.

#### Church Finances

As we said in our November Newsletter, our church of St Nicolas was running at a loss of around £1000 a month in 2021. The patronal donations are a big help, thank you once again, but we are still running at a loss and we are very grateful for all that you can give. The prospects for 2022 are for some improvement with the hall bookings increasing but we will not be up to pre-pandemic numbers for some time to come.

### 10% Giving Update

Each year we put aside 10% of the money you have given to give away to other charities. It is 10% because there is a biblical precedent for a 10% 'tithe' to be made. It stems from Old Testament principles when the Israelites were instructed to give 10% of their income/produce as a means of supporting the worship of the community. We have a small group who work together to recommend where to give the money to deserving causes. The group recommend charities for approval by the PCC. In 2021 we have given to the following charities where there have been emergency appeals.

Red Cross India Covid Appeal	£1,389.50	28/04/2021
Christian Aid for Haiti Appeal	£1,725.50	13/09/2021
Médecins Sans Frontières (UK)	£1,725.50	26/11/2021

We have one more donation to give for 2021 and we plan to keep to the principle of an emergency appeal for our final donation.







We started our Alpha journey at the end of September and on 15<sup>th</sup> December it will be our final Alpha night as a group – How time fly's, especially when you have been enjoying ourselves! We were able to share food together and say a prayer before each session (I think I have put on about a stone just by eating the food !!), which included, Curry, Pasta Bake, Chip Butties, Nut Roast and lots of cakes and sweets (I didn't eat them all at once?!).

As a small group, we quickly got to know each other pretty well and over the weeks, we were all confident to provide our views and opinions on the topics we were discussing. We were all able to share personal stories and at times show our vulnerabilities, in a safe, secure and respectful environment.

The Alpha course is designed to make feel people at ease and work at a pace that is suited to the individual, this is especially important because as a group, we all are on different journeys in relation to our faith and Christianity.

Each week we had a different topic to discuss, we watched a video and then had the opportunity as a group to discuss. Themes such as who is Jesus?, How and Why do I Pray? Can you Forgive? Why did Jesus Die? and Good v Evil, were some of the topics, which certainly provided some lively and interesting discussions.

We were also able to have an away day (Holy Spirit Day), which was held at St James', despite the snow and cold weather, as a group we had time to reflect on our journey so far. The very talented Sally-Ann helped with our reflection and the music and played some wonderful songs (Thanks!). Again we did this with lots of food and drinks (non alcoholic!).

As always with these types of events, there are lots of people who contributed to making it possible, so a special thanks to Peter Rogers, Adam Fielder, Dawn Beasley and Dean Moore and of course the participants themselves. Thanks to all your efforts and contributions!!.

So what next? We will continue to support each other and continue to pray and challenge ourselves about our faith and get ourselves closer to God. I have no doubt there will be other opportunities to get involved in other groups at St Nicplas so they can continue their journey of faith and love for our Lord Jesus Christ.

I have no doubt we will run another Alpha course sometime next year, so if you are interested please let me know.
