Dear Friends,

I'm sure we've all had that experience of suddenly seeing something for the first time on a familiar route and wondering if it has just appeared or was always there.

It happened to me recently because I was walking along a road that I normally drive down, and so a combination of speed and concentration had 'hidden' that object from sight. We can also see something for the first time as a result of trees being pruned and foliage removed.

Slowing down, simplifying and stopping, are vital ways of 'seeing' spiritually too.

And these are essential ingredients of Lent, which is a time for looking more carefully at the world around us, our place in it and what God requires of each of us.

So how about taking up an activity this Lent that will help you in the process of 'seeing' things God's way:

Ash Wednesday Service 2 March – to mark the beginning of Lent, we will hold two services on that day, and I hope that one will be at a time convenient for you. The Communion services with optional ashing (having the sign of the cross on your forehead) are at 10 am in St Nicolas Church and 7 pm in St James.

Living Generously Lent Course – we're running three joint Lent groups this year and using the material prepared by Coventry Diocese staff based around the extravagant generosity of Mary, who anointed Jesus' feet with expensive perfume. The five session course will cover the following topics: introduction to living generously; generosity with time, attention, possessions, wealth, talents,

comfort and reputation; practical next steps for living generously. Each participant will receive a booklet of short reflections to help set the scene. The sessions will include activities for receiving, responding and reflecting on the theme. Sessions will take place on:

- Tuesday evenings 7 pm in St James Hall
- Wednesday mornings 10 am in St Nicolas
- Saturday morning 9 am (starting with breakfast) in St Nicolas Lounge

Sign up for one of these groups in either church, or with Marina.

Do something you don't normally do to spend time with God

What I mean is, if you find it difficult to attend Morning Prayer every Monday, how about just attending during Lent as a way of marking the season and making yourself open to see things God's way. Or perhaps read a Christian book if you don't normally read Christian books, or sit still in God's presence for 15 mins if you are always on the go. Whatever you decide to do, invite God to help you draw nearer to him and see his world from his perspective.

So this Lent, please do take time to slow down, stop and perhaps see things that you might have missed before, or think about things which you haven't had time for in the busyness of life. And do come along to as many of the special Lent activities as you are able.

We usually start at 09:30 and normally lasts an hour.








LENT COURSES:



2 Corinthians 9:7 St Nicolas Finance Update

We are not out of the woods but things are improving

I am pleased to say that we have some good news about our church finances.

In December we had a good month for income, thank you to everyone who gave us money.

The highlight was on 5 December, our St Nicolas Patronal Festival, where the collections and donations amounted to £1108.

We collected money at the Carol Service for Christian Aid £50 and we gave The Children's Society £379 from our Crib Service in December and Christingle Service in January.

We have also paid out most of the money available for 2021 from our 10% Giving Fund, giving money to these causes:

Red Cross India Covid Appeal	£1,389.50
Christian Aid for Haiti earthquake Appeal	£1,725.50
Médecins Sans Frontières (UK) Afghanistan	£1,725.50
Long-standing commitment to the Compassion Charity to	
fund education for a student called Evelyn	£336.00
Uganda Sustainable Agriculture School - fees for training	
interpreters to enable them to train deaf students in	
Agriculture	£950.00
Total Spent	£6,126.50

I am pleased to say that we have £6969 available to continue with our 10% Giving commitment in 2022.

Bookings for the church hall have picked up significantly to the extent that we are nearly fully booked each week. This will make a big difference to our ongoing finances. Thank you very much to Marina for your work on this.

So, as the Beatles would say "I have to admit it's getting better"!

However our expenses are still more than our income so please can I ask you to give as generously as you can to our church?


Childrens Station of the Cross.
