Dear Friends,

This month we celebrate Easter on 17 April and it's also such an exciting season for new growth.

The seeds I sowed recently are beginning to germinate – Lupins are winning, and it looks like Kale is coming in second. Spring is a beautiful time of year, where the freshness of new life abounds everywhere, but it doesn't last, as spring gives way to summer. However, the fresh start and new life available to those who believe and trust in Jesus Christ is like a new beginning every day in our relationship with God. In his death, Jesus took the punishment for our failings, and rose again to reveal they had been dealt with once and for all and need no longer lead to spiritual separation from God. So, for every day to be a resurrection day, each of us needs to believe that he died and rose again for us personally.

But is it foolish to believe that Jesus rose again. I don't think so, for the following reasons:

**Resurrection appearances** – the Bible records a number of individual, group, and crowd appearances of Jesus after the resurrection. The Apostle Paul says, 'he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living.' This is a substantial number of witnesses, who at the time of making that claim, could have been investigated to check out the claim's validity.

*Individuals transformed* – at the time, and since, individuals have been prepared to stake their lives on the resurrection, and St Peter was transformed from a 'sand' man to a 'rock' man following the resurrection and the subsequent outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

**Status of Jesus as 'Lord'** – after the resurrection, Jesus' followers started using the word 'Lord', previously used only of God, to describe Jesus. His resurrection must have been a sufficiently momentous supernatural event to bring about this change in Jesus' status.

**Existence of the Church** – throughout the world there are vast numbers of people who claim a similar conviction that Jesus not only rose from the dead, but is alive today. And it is estimated that this group continues to grow at a rate of 70,000 people a day.

*No body in the tomb* – the early opponents of Christianity could have put a stop to the new faith in 'Jesus as Lord' by finding the body, but the best they could do was to bribe the guards to say that Jesus' disciples had taken the body away! (recorded in Matthew Chapter 28 verses 11-15).

The first letter of each evidence category above spells RISEN!

Jesus Christ is risen; He is risen indeed, hallelujah!

#### <u>UPDATE</u>

The interview process for a new vicar has now been completed and we are awaiting a decision by the Diocese, once a decision has been made an announcement will be made.



St Nicolas Church donated £3550 to Ukraine appeal which with matched funding boosts it to £7100. It is half of our 10% charitable giving for the year.

#### St Nicolas APCM 2022

This year our church AGM (Annual Parochial Church Meeting) is on Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> April following on from the morning service. In the Church of England all churches hold these meetings at around this time. As with any organisation's AGM there are certain things which we have to do, such as presenting the annual accounts, and electing those people who are going to represent the congregation in running the church.

Every year we elect two churchwardens who primarily look after the building, but in the absence of a vicar, as now, they are officially in charge. Every three years we elect three deanery synod members to represent St Nicolas in the local area. In addition, we elect members of the church to be PCC members. The Parochial Church Council is the board of trustees responsible for administering the charity which is St Nicolas Church.

If you want to take part in the APCM then you need to be on the Electoral Roll, which is just you signing a form to say that St Nicolas is your church. If you want to stand for the PCC, then you need to have been on the Electoral Roll for at least 6 months.
