### Pentecost Jubilee Celebrations

Despite being thoroughly up for celebrating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, I don't think that Her Majesty the Queen would be keen on it overshadowing Pentecost. Our Queen's devotion to service and duty has been energised by her faith in God, which in turn has been energised by the power of the Holy Spirit.

In the special book of devotions given to her by Archbishop Fisher to enable her to prepare for her coronation, he reminded her that she was not alone in this task. He quoted from Acts: 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.' So, in churches across the Commonwealth, Christians will be celebrating the Queen's Jubilee alongside Pentecost. When the Queen began her reign, Pentecost was more commonly referred to as Whit Sunday and the Spring Bank Holiday as Whit Monday being celebrated with parades and new clothes, referencing the work of the Holy Spirit to renew and purify followers of Jesus. This renewing work of the Holy Spirit is for sharing. The Apostle Paul speaks of gifts of the Holy Spirit enabling Christians to do things they wouldn't naturally be able to do, and the fruit of the Spirit enabling us to exhibit in some measure the character traits of Jesus. The Holy Spirit enables us to serve others better.

Prior to Pentecost, in the Old Testament, the Holy Spirit's activity centred around people with special roles like prophets, priests and royalty. The infilling of the Holy Spirit firstly on all sorts of people represented a major step change, so much so that Pentecost is sometimes referred to as the birthday of the church.

The Holy Spirit isn't just a doctrine; he's about practical Christian living, worship and being. He needs to be experienced. The first Pentecost was a profound experience of God. Like many Christians, it was a few years before I realised that the Holy Spirit was God's resource to help us live for him. From that point on I began asking God for a daily filling of the Holy Spirit in line with the biblical instruction 'go on being filled with the Spirit' (Ephesians chapter 5 verse 18b). The best way to celebrate Pentecost is to go on being filled with the Spirit so we experience more of him and other people see more of God in our lives.
