## Amen.








Which is more important - Christmas or Easter? If you look at the way our nation prepares for these, and celebrates them, the answer is pretty obviously the former, as 'festive' goods are in the shops months before the event, and far more money [always a good indicator of what is most important to us] is spent on food and drink.

But if you look at the Christian faith, it is the other way round. It is Easter, not Christmas, which is most important. Just think about this. If you take Christmas out of the Bible, all you remove is two chapters of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. But if you take Easter out of the Bible, you remove the whole of the New Testament, and also the whole of the Christian faith.

Easter is not just about remembering an event in the past. It is that, and gloriously so, but it's also about encountering the risen Lord here and now. And what a transformation this can bring to us. Think about the witnesses to the resurrection, and the change it brought to their lives. For Mary Magdalene, it changed her sorrow to joy; for Thomas, doubt to faith; for the disciples hiding in the upper room, fear to confidence; for the disciples on the Emmaus road, an end to a new beginning; for Peter, failure to forgiveness and restoration.

How has this Easter changed you and me? What might the risen Lord want to do in our lives today? **Martin Butt**

# **Thy Kingdom Come 2022**

Thy Kingdom Come is a worldwide prayer initiative that takes place between Ascension (26 May) and Pentecost (5 June) with a particular focus on praying for our outreach as individuals and as churches.

The Archbishop of Canterbury writes:

'In the days between Ascension and Pentecost, it has been the habit of many Christians, for many centuries, to make the focus of our prayers the same as those first believers. Christ's last instruction to His disciples on the day of His Ascension is to 'wait for the gift my Father promised' (Acts 1:4).

12 Then the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives... <sup>13</sup> When they arrived, they went upstairs to the room where they were staying... <sup>14</sup> They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers. Acts 1:12-14

The instruction to wait for the Holy Spirit is so important because without the Spirit's empowering presence, it is impossible to be a faithful witness to Christ. We need this gift of the Father to be the people Christ is calling us to be. The Spirit then isn't for some private experience, but for the sake of our life for Christ in the world.

Thy Kingdom Come encourages each of us to hold five specific people in mind in these days; so that the gift of the Father would work through us for their sake, but also would touch their own lives.'

This time will also be a gardening morning as. If people have a petrol strimmer or cutting down tools or any other garden tools to bring along it would be appreciated.





Hi AGAIN from us and our DHU advocates in Kitgum, N Uganda.

37degs, remote town with many deaf from fragmented families...



Geoffrey, our DHU partner there, has identified a doctor and two qualified, experienced nurse to run an information/advice session in women's health issues. Then we welcomed Hope and Dorcas, two female DHU interpreters to interpret at the

So Geoffrey be informed the deaf, and the session ran very successfully -the first of its kind in Kitgum if not for the whole region. Evaluations were made for future

reference and another region is now crying out for a similar training!

Our Kampala DHU advocate Hope found the Ugandan National Deaf Association (UNAD) signed CD on the same topic was also useful to acquire new specialist medical signs, and for follow up.

Now we all have a clearer idea of what the priority content of future sign posters should be.

- 1. Local and national DHU lead advocate meets local deaf lead advocate and their group members to learn needs
- 2. DHU co-ord advocate meets National deaf advocate to identify past/future responses to similar deaf felt needs
- Introductions

  3. Local DHU lead advocate identifies willing relevant local expertise ready to plan/interpret training curriculum. 4. Agreed local and national expertise/advocates finalise target youth/adult females' educational needs, goals.



Planning & Implementation

AIM: Teaching program is well, organised, prepared, relevant, needs appropriate, well attended

- 5. Teachers' finalise teach topics & send teaching notes to agreed S/L interpreters(F) to prepare themselves
- Teachers & Advocates finalise proposed teaching dates & success criterion, venue, logistics, budget.
- 7. Teachers and Advocates finalise topic order & timeplan to maximise participant learning attention/progress.
- 8. Local DHU lead advocate visits homes of target deaf youth/adults to inform guardians & seek their blessing,
- 9. Whole team gathers for illustrated, interpreted & interactive teaching sessions with clear, agreed, shared success criterion



**Evaluation &** Recommendations

AIM: Medics, Interpreters, DHU advocates, deaf women better prepared to support, model to / teach others

- 10. All involved self evaluate and collectively share what they have learnt about God, others & themselves.
- 12. All contribute experience to what future signed health posters need to communicate how that is done.
