

Welcome to the April Newsletter



Easter is at the heart of the Christian faith! Christians are 'Easter People'. We live on the other side of the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. We live in the light of the hope of our resurrection: Eternal life in God's presence in a renewed, new creation.

However, on Passion Sunday as we reflected on the wonderful passage in John's Gospel of the raising of Lazarus it struck me that even though knowing he would raise Lazarus from death, Jesus so connected with the grief of his friend Lazarus' sisters and their friends. John 11:35 says simply but powerfully "Jesus wept".

Jesus' wasn't doubting God's goodness when he wept but recognising and coming alongside his friends in pain - the pain that this broken world and death has brought in. Paul in 1 Thess 4:13-18 reminds us that we do not grieve as those without hope - but we do grieve! We weep with those who weep - As Jesus weeps with us.

The last year and even month has brought with it a significant number of deaths of those connected to our churches: Jesus stands with us in the pain of those loses - but he also leads us, through death and grief to the sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life. One of our great Easter hymns puts it like this:

Lo, **Jesus meets us**, risen from the tomb. **Lovingly** He greets us, **scatters fear and gloom**;

let His church with gladness hymns of triumph sing,
for the Lord now liveth; death hath lost its sting.

Death's 'sting' is not the loss and grief we feel - which is very real and natural when we lose those we love but the power that death seems to hold us under that says that this is all there is - resurrection means there is more to come. Resurrection means the pressure to do everything in this life disappears. Resurrection means we live today more free.

What will I get?

Each hamper will contain a selection of frozen, fresh and food cupboard items. There should be enough for a few meals, depending on how many are within your household. For households of over 4 people, please book two hamper tickets.

Who are the hampers for?

Anyone who is in need can book a hamper. The idea is that the hamper will provide a boost to your food shopping for the week, rather than providing a full week of food.

How do I book?

Hampers can only be booked on the week for the collection day that week, which is always a Friday. Tickets will be released at the beginning of the week. To book simply pick a free 'Food Hamper' ticket, put in your details and checkout.

How do I get my hamper?

Once you have booked, just come into Saints Cafe (on Newdegate St) on the Friday between 10am-12pm to collect your hamper





Mission Updates

St Nicolas 10% Group

I would like to give everyone some good news with an update about how St Nicolas Church has been helping others with donations this year.

Every year we donate 10% of the money that is given to us to other charities. This year so far we have given money to following causes.

- £500 to continue with the sustainable agriculture project in Uganda. This is an education programme to help deaf people and others in Uganda work towards a sustainable agriculture system. Please ask Adam Fielder if you would like to know more.
- Two donations to help the work of charities supporting people affected by the earthquake in Turkey and Syria. The donations were a total of £2000 and we managed to get fund matching so our donations have resulted in £4000 being given to help the work in Turkey and Syria.

We still have some money left to give later this year. What a privilege to be able to be part of transforming communities globally

Mission Updates

Deaf Hearing United

Dear Friends & Partners. Here in the Northern hemisphere we're longing for warmer and drier weather and longer daylight hours Thankfully spring flowers are blossoming!

Redeeming Love was a powerful film that encouraged and challenged us numerous deaf AND hearing UK/Uganda participants who joined our on-line monthly Fathom Film Workshop(FFW) in January. It was captioned & interpreted. February's FFW was a famous silent movie, Battleship Potemkin. This made discussion even more thought provoking...

A new break-though was the deaf &hearing participants being able to exchange views much more easily because of the interpreters/captions! Two part-icipants, Grace, deaf, and Hope, an interpreter, gave their film feedback bi-lingually.

Redeeming Love is based on a book with the same title, written by Francine Rivers. The book in turn is loosely based on a contemporary version of the old Testament book, of Hosea. Hosea opens with the following challenging command:-

1 This is the LORD's message that came to Hosea son of Beeri during the time that Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah were kings of Judah, and Jeroboam son of Joash was king of Israel. 2 This was the LORD's first message to Hosea. The LORD said, "Go, marry a prostitute who has had children as a result of her prostitution. Do this because the people in this country have acted like prostitutes-...been unfaithful to the LORD."

Then later in the book of Hosea the Lord's desire to redeem the nation from their unreliable political alliances, as Hosea was to redeem Gomer from her lovers who were uncommitted to her.:

"Woe to them, because they have strayed from me! Destruction to them, because they have rebelled against me! I long to redeem them but they speak about me falsely. Hosea 7:13

"I will deliver this people from the power of the grave; I will redeem them from death. Where, O death, are your plagues? Where, O grave, is your destruction?, ... Hosea 13:14.

DHU's heart is for us, both deaf & hearing, to redeem our view of our self of each other... be we relatives', friends', neighbours', or colleagues'!
