





our Saviour Jesus Christ.



Churches Count on Nature: Saturday 3rd June – Sunday 12th June

This week, (including 2 weekends, is designated by Caring for God's Acre as Love your Burial Ground Week (previously know as Cherishing Churchyards week). They have joined with A Rocha and The Church of England and Church in Wales to encourage churches to get involved in recording the nature around them (regardless of whether this is used for burials) and an opportunity to connect people to that nature.

Photograph from the discussion and workshop we did last November when the need for a Sunday school became very apparent.

We, Adam and Helen Fielder and Joey McCaroll will be able to take them on our forthcoming visit. We have partnered with St Philips Church Signed fellowship northwest Uganda since 2009.

When we first went to St Philips Deaf church as it was then called the congregation was full of young adults and older adults with grown children. Today there are some 17 young children aged between 0 and 13 and they have been trying to start a sign led Sunday school with voice over for these young people. Until recently the church policy had been to cater for the children of deaf adults in the voice led Sunday schools which met at a different time to the parents signed fellowship. This has been logistically challenging, and all the children said that they would prefer to attend Church with their parents even though they the children are hearing, and the parents are deaf. The church has taken note and has asked us to help in developing the signed Sunday School with voice over.


